

Tactical Combat Care (TCCC)



Almost 90% of all combat deaths occur before casualty reaches a medical treatment facility. The Tactical Combat Care course aims to provide students with the skills to identify and treat casualties with preventable causes of death and keep them alive long enough to reach hospital.

This course is designed for those who treat trauma whilst under fire. This includes:

- Military Medics
- Non-military Medics
- Military Personnel
- Private Security Contractors
- Maritime Security Sector
- Specialist Firearms Police Officers

TCCC-ASM for All Service Members: 7-hour course for anyone serving in a high threat environment

TCCC-MP for Medical Personnel: 16-hour course for military/high threat medical personnel, paramedics, nurses, doctors, ODPs, DCS team members deploying in support of combat/high threat operations

TCCC-CLS Combat Lifesaver: 40-hour course for non-medical military personnel deploying in support of combat or working in high threat operational theatres

- Airway Assessment
- Treating Shock
- Treating Traumatic Brain Injury
